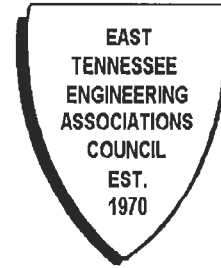
We appreciate your continued support of this cooperative program to provide scholarships for undergraduate engineering studies to deserving high school seniors.
